**HISTORICAL MUSEUM PRESENTS MIAMI CIRCLE LEADERSHIP BRIEFING
TO SHOWCASE FUTURE PLANS OF THE HISTORIC SITE**

The *Leadership Briefing: Miami Circle* is the title of the 5 p.m. presentation being conducted Wednesday, May 6th by the [Historical Museum of Southern Florida's](#) Curator of Object Collections, Jorge Zamanillo, State Archaeologist and Chief, [Florida Bureau of Archaeological Research](#) Ryan J. Wheeler, Ph.D., and Jay R. Hood, RLA, ASLA from [Glatting Jackson Kercher Anglin, Inc.](#)

The outline for the meeting will be to recap the developments undertaken at the [Miami Circle](#), a [National Historic Landmark site](#) at the mouth of the Miami River, since the execution of the lease by HMSF with the State of Florida. The speakers will brief the public about the ongoing construction efforts to repair the seawall, the development of a site master plan and future expansion plans at the archaeological site. "It is very exciting and gratifying for us at HMSF to be able to tell the story of what the Circle means," said Jorge Zamanillo, HMSF's Curator of Object Collections. "The community needs to learn about all the progress that has been made since our involvement with the site," Zamanillo added.
